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### 1. Case #1

- a. 36 yo M presents with eye redness, pain, photophobia, and tearing
- b. Keratoconus and RGP use
- c. Exam with diffuse injection, focal cornea edema with overlying microcystic edema and bullae, no infiltrate, anterior chamber deep with rare cell
- d. Differential Diagnosis?
- e. Acute Corneal Hydrops
- f. Sequential approach to treatment and management
  - i. Spontaneous resolution
  - ii. Tx focused to increase pt comfort and prevent sequelae
  - iii. Pneumatic descemetopexy
  - iv. Visually significant scarring and need for post resolution corneal transplantation
- g. Surgical Management of KCN

Treatment & Management i. Observation ii. Endothelial Keratoplasty iii. DSO h. Etiology/Epidemiology 3. Case #3 a. 63 yo F with fluctuating blurry vision, redness, and photophobia b. Chronic "eye infection" with flare- ups c. Adnexa exam and findings d. Other pertinent exam findings e. Clinical features: i. Lid margin telangiectasias (81%) ii. MGD (78%) iii. Blepharitis (65%)

- a. 14 yoF with photophobia, fluctuating vision, and photophobia
- b. Chronic symptoms but worsening in OS over one week
- c. Blepharitis and allergic conjunctivitis
- d. Conjunctival injection with corneal nodular infiltrate with engorged KNV
- e. Organisms
- f. Treatment
  - i. Antibacterial
  - ii. Anti- inflammatory
  - iii. Treat the blepharitis
- g. Differential Diagnoses for Corneal nodule and irritation

### 5. Case #5

- a. 62 yoF with 2 year painless, progressive vision loss in both eyes
- b. Vision loss at distance and near
- c. Multiple updates of spectacle prescription
- d. Dry eye and allergic conjunctivitis
- e. No trauma

f. Greyish nodules between corneal epithelium and bowman's layer, extending into visual axis g. Other tests h. Diagnosis i. Treatment and clinical course i. SK ii. PTK 6. Case # 6 a. 24 yoM with bilateral photophobia, FBS, and tearing, OS>>OD b. Decade long history of relapsing and remitting symptoms c. Small, stellate intraepithelial opacities without fluorescein staining, compact stroma without K edema or KP d. Diagnosis i. Differential Diagnoses e. Clinical Course f. Treatment 7. Case #7 a. 37 yoF presents with 3 day right eye pain, photophobia, decreased vision b. Conjunctival Injection with central dendritic epithelial defects, clear stroma, no endothelial inflammation c. Differential diagnosis: i. HSV epithelial keratitis

- iv. Acanthamoeba keratitis
